RESERVATION INFORMATION

Friday, Sept. 18

The Maidstone Marina at Three Mile Harbor, East Hampton, New York, will host the rendezvous. Mr. and Mrs. Stephen A. Palmer, owners and operators, and cordial host and hostess to previous rendezvous, will receive directly reservations for dinner and docking until Sept. 12. Their telephone is East Hampton 4-1650. Taxi service is available.

Docking and Mooring: The fifteen 300 pound mushroom moorings are on a first-come, first-served basis (\$2.50/night). Dock space at \$2.50/night (Fleet rate) must be reserved in advance. (Maximum draft 5-1/2 feet at Marina Dock - check latest chart for depths elsewhere.)

Dinner: A choice of chicken barbecue at a cost of \$3.50/person or Lazy Lobster, fresh from Montauk, not frozen, \$4.50/person. Reservations for dinner (with payment enclosed) must be made in advance to facilitate planning. Tickets confirming reservations will be sent; people with reservations will be served first.
