Annual Spring Races May 30th and 31st, 1941

Except for lack of wind or too much, or presence of fog too thick for safe maneuvering at the start, the races will be started at the times and sailed over the courses given in the enclosed circular. If there is a postponement the committee boat will hoist a signal flag P. Postponements will be for 15 minute periods. Regardless of the time of start, the time limit will expire at 6 P.M. each day.

The starting signals will be as follows on Friday, May 30th and Saturday, May 31st, Daylight Saving Time.

To recall a yacht that starts ahead of time a horn will be blown from the committee boat. As you know failure to blow the horn or to hear it does not relieve a yacht starting ahead of time and failing to restart, from being disqualified.

Immediately after crossing the finish line each day every yacht MUST report its identity to the committee boat to avoid errors.

Note for the benefit of newcomers to our races. All the right of way rules are fully in force, but there are a number of technical rules in the N.A.Y.R.U. book which we disregard. If further information is desired consult Mr. Sanford Lawton, Chairman of the Race Committee, who will be aboard Stan Bradford's cutter "Spookie."

The Race Committee will meet immediately after each race to determine the winners and to hear protests, if any. We do not expect to be able to give the standing of all boats immediately, but complete standing of all yachts will be mailed to the owners as soon as possible after the races.

There will be first and second prizes for each day's race for Classes B, C, D and E, instead of prizes for the two days races as in the past.

The Shelter Island Yacht Club at Dering Harbor have very kindly opened their Club house Friday night for all members of the fleet, and the Entertainment Committee will be on hand. The Committee will also throw an Off Soundings Club party at Duck Island. At these parties the winners will be announced. We expect to have adequate water taxi service at both Dering Harbor and Duck Island. Your fog horn signal will be responded to as soon as possible. The taxi will not be available for transportation to Greenport. The taxi will run until 10:30 P.M. at Dering and at Duck Island.
