Report of the Vice Commodore

Arrangements have been made with the Sheraton Norwich for our Annual Meeting and Dinner, scheduled for Saturday, April 6, 1985.

The Seamen's Inne now has a limit of 250 people, although they might increase to 300 at the expense of cocktail party space. In any event, the Inne is not available until 1900 on April 6th; the same on April 13th; and March 30th is not acceptable to the Vice Commodore. After a search, the Sheraton Norwich was selected.

Commodore Granbery and Treasurer Strang have inspected the Sheraton's facilities and found them adequate for 1) the Board of Governors meeting, 2) the Annual Meeting, 3) the Cocktail Party, and 4) the Annual Dinner. We have arranged for a large movie screen and plan on obtaining a projector and operator from Mystic Seaport.

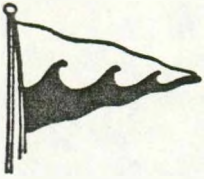
The following menu is proposed, for a price of \$19.29, which includes 22½% tax and tip:
