My aim is solely to SIMPLIFY , and along with some members of the committee, I am convinced we can do it without danger...or at least we can give it a trial.

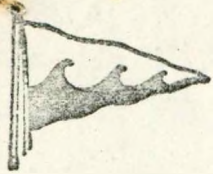
The weather problem working on the deck with the sail# list can be solved by a clear plastic "tent" under which the papers can be sheltered...or perhaps you have other ideas.


Please use the north parking lot and the north gate. As Off Soundings guests, you will be admitted with out charge.
