The Committee Boat will be provided through the courtesy of the Commander 3rd District, U. S. Coast Guard as in the past.

We have 210 entries for the race which is the largest entry list we have ever had. This is also one of the largest organized sailing races in the country. You are urged to use good judgment and to avoid situations which could result in damage to individuals and/or property.

SPECIAL NOTES:

1. If you can carry a dinghy, we urge you to bring and use it.
2. Please see that your crew does not use any dinghy other than your own without authorization.
3. The Saybrook Marine Service and the Maidstone Marina have each provided two launches for the use of Off Soundings Club members and their guests. The customary gratuity is 25 cents per person per trip.
4. On Saturday, please do not ask the Shelter Island Yacht Club's launch to ferry you ashore. It can only pick up its own members.
5. The Maidstone Marine Restaurant is open. Please forward your reservations to Mrs. Palmer promptly. The moorings are now all reserved. Contact Mrs. Palmer on arrival for any additional needed space.

Please do not dump debris of any kind while in the harbors. Remember, we want to be asked to come again.

The Navy has advised there will be no operations in the restricted area around the Ruins on Friday and Saturday.

RENDEZVOUS:

The first evening, Friday, June 10th, we will hold our rendezvous at Three Mile Harbor adjacent to the Maidstone Marina. The second evening, the rendezvous will be held as usual at the Shelter Island Yacht Club, Dering Harbor.


To correct existing confusion regarding invitations for guests to race with the Off Soundings Club, we list the following conditions:

1. A guest may race with Off Soundings providing he has submitted to the race secretary letters of invitation signed by three Off Soundings Club members. They should briefly list how long they have known the guest and other pertinent facts, including his correct address. The guest in question will receive a guest card stating who wrote the letters of invitation. These invitations are good for any two consecutive race series only, regardless of whether the guest sails with us or not.

Don't forget to forward any unusual or amusing incidents to the Race Secretary immediately upon your return home so that they may be included in the spring race results.

PRIZES

RESULTS: After each day's race, results will be announced. Complete results will be mailed later to all members and guests on our mailing list. Trophies will be engraved and mailed to all winners.

Prizes will be awarded as follows: 1st prize if three or more boats start, second prize if five or more start, third if ten or more start and fourth if fifteen or more start.

As is customary during Club races, all prizes are given on a "corrected time" basis computed from the results of two days of racing.

We are continuing the practice of adding handicaps to former prize winners. Any boat winning a first, second, or third place will carry a penalty until the boat and owner have participated in three additional race series, at which time the oldest incurred penalty will be removed. A 15% for a first place, 10% for a second and 5% for a third, with a maximum of 45% total penalty, will prevail.

Handicaps are applied to rating lengths.

RACE INSTRUCTIONS

All times in these instructions are Eastern Daylight Time.

STARTING SIGNALS AND COURSES

The signals listed below will be lowered 30 seconds before the hoisting of the next signal.

The start signal for a class will be the warning signal for the next class.

COURSES

Friday, June 10, 1960

Starting line between Sarah's Ledge Buoy and the white flag on the committee boat.

Classes B-1, A-1, A-2 and C-1 -- Long Course, 25.3 Miles.

Cross starting line; thence to N-2 off Race Point leaving to port; thence to Cerberus Shoal Whistle Buoy 9 leaving it to starboard; thence to FL. Bell "1G1" (Ruins) leaving to port; thence to finish line between white flag on committee boat and N-2 (entrance to Sag Harbor).

Classes B-2 and C-2 -- Short Course, 16.9 Miles.

Cross starting line; thence to FL. Bell "1-A" (Valiant Rock) leaving to starboard; thence to FL. Bell "1G1" (Ruins) leaving it to port; thence to finish line between white flag on committee boat and N-2 (entrance to Sag Harbor).

COURSES

Saturday, June 11, 1960

Starting line between N-2 (entrance to Sag Harbor) and the white flag on the committee boat.

Classes B-1, A-1, A-2 and C-1 -- Long Course, 23.1 Miles.

Cross starting line; thence to BW Bell leaving to starboard; thence to N-2 (Constellation Rock) leaving it to starboard; thence to FL. Bell "1G1" (Ruins) leaving it to port; thence to N-2 (entrance to Sag Harbor) leaving it to starboard; thence to finish line between white flag on committee boat and BW Bell.

Classes B-2 and C-2 -- Short Course, 14.6 Miles.

Cross starting line; thence to BW Bell leaving it to starboard; thence to N-12 (Crow Shoal) leaving it to starboard; thence to N-4 (entrance to Sag Harbor) leaving it to starboard; thence to finish line between white flag on the committee boat and BW Bell.

For Start

1. Yachts not starting must keep well clear of the starting area until after the warning signal for their class.
2. Running of engine after the Preparatory Signal for her class will disqualify a yacht.
3. Recall signal will be a blast of a whistle for each yacht recalled. A yacht failing to hear or heed such whistle will be penalized by having one-half hour added to her elapsed time.
4. Postponements will be for 15 minute periods and will be signalled by code flag "P". Attention to this signal will be called by two guns. The warning signal (white shape) will be made 30 seconds after the lowering of code flag "P". If the postponement is made after the start of the first class, there will be a warning signal (shape to be start signal of previous class) five minutes before the preparatory gun of the next class scheduled to start.
5. Reverse course will be signalled by code flag "R". Attention to this signal will be called by one gun.
6. Short course for classes B-1, A-1, A-2 and C-1 will be signalled by code flag "S". Attention to this signal will be called by one gun.
7. Race off for the day will be signalled by code flag "O". Attention to this signal will be called by two guns.

For Race

1. Government marks may be disregarded except those marking the course for your class.

2. In case of thick weather, yachts rounding course marks must see and identify each mark rounded. It is not sufficient to assume that a mark has been rounded by the yacht's presumed position.

3. Yachts must pass south of Little Gull Island, Great Gull Island and Plum Island, and are not to pass between the Ruins and Gardiners Island.

At Finish

1. Identification number is to be displayed a half mile from the finish line and faced towards the committee boat so it can be seen until crossing the finish line. Failure to do so may result in your yacht being listed as D. N. F. Please report to committee boat if in doubt.

2. Regardless of the time of the start, the time limit will expire at 5:00 P.M. each day. If any yacht finishes by that time, it is a race for her class.

3. On Friday, if the committee boat is not on station, any yachts finishing shall take their own time when N-2 bears northwest magnetic and at a distance not greater than 200 yards. On Saturday, yachts shall take their own time when the BW Bell bears northeast at the same distance and report same to the chairman of the Race Committee.

Protests

A member of the Race Committee will be stationed aboard the committee boat to observe any infractions of the rules should they occur.

Rules of the road apply only when meeting nonracing boats. Otherwise, throughout the race, NAYRU rules apply. These are short, concise, and easy to understand. Read them -- this is sure to help everyone. Know your rights, but consider your competitors, particularly when steerageway is questionable.

If A Protest Is Necessary

1. Immediately display a red flag in the starboard rigging.

2. Verbally inform Race Committee on the committee boat immediately after crossing the finish line.

3. Leave a brief written summary Friday evening with the race secretary, who will be at the dock at the Maidstone Marina or with the steward of the Shelter Island Yacht Club the second night and remain within "loud hailer" distance so that you will know when and where to attend the protest meeting.

Should late finishes and/or bad weather prevail, you will be notified over the "loud hailer" by the Chairman of the Protest Committee, Rod Stephens, concerning the time and place for the protest meeting.
