May 29th and 30th 1936

Except for the lack of wind or presence of fog too thick for safe maneuvering at the start, the first race will start at 8 A.M., D. S. T. the second race at 9 A.M., D. S. T. If there is fog or not enough wind to start the Committee boat will hoist signal flag P. Postponements will be for 15 minute periods. Regardless of the time of starts, the time limits will expire at 8 P.M. and 9 P.M. respectively.

The yachts will all start together. Ten minutes before the start a horn will be blown, five minutes before the start a gun will be fired and at the start a gun will be fired.

To recall a yacht that starts ahead of time, a horn will be blown from the Committee boat. As you know, failure to blow the horn or to hear it does not relieve a boat starting ahead of time, and failing to restart, from being disqualified.

Arthur Johnson, Chairman of the Race Committee, will be on board the Aries if any additional information is desired. The Race Committee will meet immediately after each race to determine the winners, and to hear protests if any.

The point score will be as follows for each day:

1st 25, 2nd 22, 3rd 20, 4th 19, 5th 18, 6th 17, 7th 16,  
8th 15, 9th 14, 10th 13, 11th 12, 12th 11, 13th 10,  
14th 9, 15th 8, 16th 7, 17th 6, 18th 5, 19th 4, 20th 3,  
21st 2, 22nd 1, and 1 point to every boat that finishes  
thereafter.

The boat with the highest total of points for the two days wins. In case of a tie in points the tie will be broken by awarding the prize to the boat of the tied pair with the shortest corrected time for the two days.

There will be a first and second prize for each day's race and a grand first and second prize for the winners of the greatest number of points for the two days races. There has been offered a prize for the May 29th race for the boat with the longest elapsed time. (No handicap). In other words the last boat to cross the finish line without the aid of an engine or a tow line.
