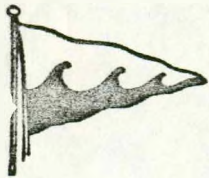

PRIZES AND AWARDS COMMITTEE REPORT

The 1985 Spring ~~Fall~~ Series winners were awarded four different pewter items made locally by the Woodbury Pewter Co. These 36 items, including gift boxes and engraving, amounted to \$1,618.00.

The Fall Series awards were sets of 14oz. glasses purchased through Gull Associates of Old Lyme at a cost of \$1,240.

The total expense of \$2,858 for 1985 compares to \$2,100 for 1984, \$2,500 for 1983, and \$2,400 for 1982.

Boxes for safeguarding our perpetual trophies during handling and shipping have been constructed at a cost of \$300. These will be mailed to the current holders of these trophies for return and engraving over the winter.

Keeper plaques will be purchased and engraved for award to the first three overall places in each category.

Because of their wide acceptance and popularity, the committee is planning to furnish sets of glasses again for the 1986 Spring Series and will probably go with the more traditional trophy in the Fall. Suggestions and ideas are always welcome.


