That the District Committee of this school district be authorized and empowered and is hereby authorized and empowered for and in behalf of this district to purchase five portraits, of said Capt. Elihu Spicer, with suitable frames and cause them to be placed in each of the five school rooms of this building.

RESOLVED. That a copy of these resolutions be spread on the records of this district, a copy sent to the relatives of Capt. Spicer and notice of the same be given to the public press.

I the undersigned having witnessed the proceedings of the Police Court of Hong Kong on the 23 Inst in the case of Madam Carpenter of the Am. Bark Recorder vs Capt. E. W. Nichols of said Bark. make the following statement of the whole matter as far as it fell under my observations.

I proceeded to the Court in company with Capt. Nichols Mr Keenan (U.S. Consul) Capt. J. W. Paul, Capt. A. Parston and Capt. Davis. We remained in the court room about an hour before the case was called up. Mr Keenan then protested against the Court having any jurisdiction over the case. Capt. Nichols made the same objection and requested to be released from the court, the judge told him he could not be released, and that if he, Nichols attempted to leave the Court he would have him arrested.

The judge then proceeded to examine the witnesses against Nichols who made no plea, and did not call any witnesses in his behalf.

After the judge ^{after he} had examined all the witnesses against Capt. Nichols he retired, and after an absence of about 20 minutes came in and pronounced the following sentence against Nichols viz. \$50 fine to the Queen and \$25 to Madam the Complainant, which Capt. Nichols refused to pay, the judge then sentenced Nichols to one month's imprisonment in jail.

Mr Keenan then went to the judge and as he said requested that Nichols might be permitted to go with him which was refused.

I then heard Mr Keenan request Capt. Nichols to go and ask the judge's permission to go with him. Nichols came back and said the judge would not grant it. Mr Keenan then retired from the court asking Capt. Nichols to go and dine with him -

Capt Nichols then took Mr Keenan's ^{arm} and both left the Court-house together Capt Paul, Capt Barstow and myself in company, we had proceeded a short distance when a Negro Police-man came up and laid his hand on Capt Nichols to stop him but was not heeded. We proceeded to Messrs De Silver & Co's store followed by the ushers of the court and several Policemen who remonstrated against Capt Nichols leaving. Mr Keenan said Nichols should return after he had dined with him if they were not molested this the latter objected to. We arrived at, and entered Messrs De Silver & Co's store the Police-men remaining outside at the door. After 10 minutes stay in the store I proposed to Capt Nichols to go on board of the U.S. Steamer Powhatan which he assented to. Capt Nichols Capt Paul and myself then left De Silver's store to go on board of that vessel. Closely followed by the Police Mr Keenan Capt Barstow and Capt Osgood likewise followed. Capt Nichols on his arrival on board of the Powhatan stated his case to Capt McCluny the Commander. and asked for his protection ~~which was granted~~ Mr Keenan arriving on board soon after claimed the protection of Capt McCluny for Capt Nichols. which was granted. After remaining on board about ten hours we went on shore leaving Capt Nichols on board of the Powhatan. The above statement is, to the best of my knowledge and belief strictly true.
