

NEW EXHIBITS  
AT  
MYSTIC SEAPORT

NORTH BOAT SHED - an exhibit of handsomely restored canoes showing fine craftsmanship, power launches and workboats.

STILLMAN BUILDING - SOUTH WING - Sailors' Ropework and Macrame - an exhibit of this sailors' art is in cases on the west wall. Also, the superb model of the KENILWORTH, which is almost eight feet in length, is exhibited in the center of the room.

SPAR SHED - a revised exhibit of traditional small craft with a new cement floor in the building, new lighting and two newly restored boats. SANSHEE, a small Anderson catboat, was restored here at the Seaport and has joined the other catboats on the east wall. FIDDLER, the Herreshoff "15" which was reframed in Maine and then completely restored here, is exhibited along the west wall, along with Captain Nat's ALERION and a Wianno Senior.

CLIFT BLOCK - model cleaning and repair is carried out where the visitor can see it in this building which served until recently as the shipyard stockroom.

FISHERIES EXHIBIT - an exhibit on aspects of New England's fishing industry has been installed in the Noyes Building which has been a machine shop in recent years.

SHIP PRESERVATION FACILITY

The keel of the whaleship THAMES can be seen mounted on blocks as you enter the shipyard area. This ship was built in 1818 and worked until 1838 when it was run ashore at Sag Harbor. The keel was rediscovered in 1968 and given to the Seaport in December 1971.

L.A. DUNTON - our Gloucester fishing schooner, is now moored next to the lift dock where she has been reframed and planked from the waterline up throughout the forward section of the ship.
