The Race Secretary has enclosed with his First Notice three copies of the new Off Soundings Club Measurement Certificate and a stamped addressed card asking for the area of the largest headsail you intend to carry. Many of you have already received these cards and if you have previously sent them to me and intend to make no change, please ignore the card. If your present Measurement Certificate is still valid time-wise (less than 3 years old prior to May 21, 1961), and you haven't made any measurement change, you only need to send the enclosed card to me, postmarked before May 21. I will recalculate your rating accounting for the new fore triangle changes which are spelled out in the enclosed certificates. Also the certificates spell out the method and measurements required for you to arrive at the area of largest headsail (ALH).

As this recalculation of the certificates is quite a job please send in these cards as soon as possible. If a new complete measurement of your yacht is required anyway, this should be filled out on the enclosed certificates by an Off Soundings Measurer (list enclosed) or a recognized Yacht Club or Association Measurer, who must send the new certificates to me at 9 Gravel Street, Mystic, Connecticut, again to be postmarked prior to May 21.

Remember if you haven't sent in a card in the case where you already have a valid certificate to the old rule, or if you haven't got a new certificate if ordinarily required or desired, I won't be able to come up with a valid rating and time allowance for the scratch sheet and your entry can not be allowed for the Spring Races.

I hope this method of arriving at ratings to the new Off Soundings Club Measurement Rule will prove as painless as possible.

RESERVATION INFORMATION SHEET

Second night's rendezvous, Saturday, June 10th, will be in Three Mile Harbor at the Maidstone Marina, East Hampton, New York. The owners and operators of the Marina are Mr. and Mrs. Stephen A. Palmer. Please make all your reservations and contacts for docking or mooring facilities and for the chicken barbecue with Mrs. Palmer directly. Her phone number is East Hampton 4-1650. Do not make any reservations through the Off Soundings Club.

Special low rates have been obtained for our use at the following establishments. Kindly make your reservations directly with them.

Osborne Residence: 200 yards from Maidstone Marina. Rates \$10 single \$12.50 double. Reservations: Mrs. E. Monroe Osborne, Three Mile Harbor Road, East Hampton, N. Y. 5 Rooms.

Hunting Inn: East Hampton, 28 rooms \$10—single, \$12—double. Reservations: Mr. Laundau, Sherry Netherlands Hotel, New York, New York.

Sea Spray Inn: 125 rooms \$10—single, \$15—double. Reservations: Mr. Arnold Bailey, Sea Spray Inn, Ocean Avenue, East Hampton, New York.

1770 House, East Hampton: 10 rooms \$8.50 per person, one or two per room, \$9 per person with breakfast. Reservations: Mr. Williams, East Hampton, New York.

Reservations must be made no later than June 1st, accompanied by fifty per cent of the payment in advance.

If individuals prefer to go into town in groups, cab charges will run approximately \$2.50 to \$3.00.

Maidstone Marina has fifteen 300 pound mushroom moorings. *These are on a first come, first served basis.* The charge is \$2.50 per night. If you wish to reserve a space at the dock, the charge is \$2.50 per night including electricity, regardless of overall length. Maximum draft 5' to 5½'. Make your reservations for dock space directly with Mrs. Palmer no later than June 1st. *This is a Fleet Rate.*

The dinner will be a chicken barbecue at a cost of \$3.50 per person. Please make your reservations directly with Mrs. Palmer including payment no later than June 1st.
